- EQAO's accessibility policy has been updated as a part of its review cycle. EQAO employees were provided with training. The agency undertakes annual all-staff meetings to refresh all staff on accessibility compliance and the importance of keeping accessibility top of mind.
- EQAO meets with the Provincial and Demonstration Schools Branch at the Ministry of Education to discuss the needs of their students. During the past year, as a result of the branch's input, EQAO piloted an American Sign Language (ASL) version of the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test with Sir James Whitney School for the Deaf in the fall administration period of the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT), and collected feedback.
- During the past year, EQAO implemented additional enhancements to accessibility to better serve the student community as well as schools and school boards in Ontario. The enhancements include the following:
  - o Use of an interactive MS form to facilitate the ordering of alternative formats for the administration of EQAO assessments, including the OSSLT and the Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics.
  - Automation of the self-ordering of alternative formats (in EQAO's e-assessment platform) for the upcoming assessment administrations.
  - Personalized approval process when an alternative version is requested to ensure the students' needs are best served by the alternative version.
  - Addition of the software Job Action with Speech (JAWS) to the existing list of accessible software that is supported by the e-assessment platform. See list below:

- Enhanced Power BI, which was tested for accessibility, and alternative text that is embedded in the tab ordering (when using the screen reader).
- Development of an internal checklist (after consultations with other ministries) to improve usage of Power BI reports. A test is conducted to check the following elements to determine whether or not
  - the labels are correctly written and placed;
  - the audio or video content is properly audible or visible;
  - the colour contrast ratio is maintained;
  - the control actions for videos are working correctly;
  - the short keys for the menu are provided and working correctly;
  - the navigation between tabs is an easy task;
  - the application has followed all the principles and guidelines;
  - the heading is unique and conveys the meaning and structure;
  - the link text describes the content (to avoid creating ambiguity);
  - the multimedia caption is provided and meaningful;
  - the instructions are clearly given; and
  - the content is clear, concise and understandable.
- The agency is also in the process of developing an internal Power BI visibility test to ensure Power BI reports are AODA compliant.
- Data definitions have gone through testing for accessibility.
- EQAO's secure site (the site used by schools and school boards to access EQAO resources) is in the process
  of becoming accessible.
- EQAO is also moving to collect better data regarding the usage of accessible formats (e.g., who's using them, for how long).
